

# Overview of Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate results – Summer 2018



The Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate is made up of the Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate and other supporting qualifications. This summer the new Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate and the new Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate were awarded for the second time.

## Entries

There has been an increase in the entries for both the new Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate and the new Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate this year:

## Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate

The Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate is equivalent in size and demand to an A level. It uses the same grading scale and carries the same UCAS tariff points.

## Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate

The Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate is graded 'pass' or 'fail'. To achieve it a student must complete the Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate, two A levels or equivalent vocational qualifications, and achieve a grade C or above in either GCSE Mathematics or Mathematics-Numeracy, and GCSE Welsh or English language.
